Exploring best practice and innovation in creating social value across both Medium Schemes and Professional Services Frameworks



Formed in 2018 as a sub group of MSF3 Framework Community Board 2019 SVWG expanded to include PSP3 suppliers


2023 expanded to include MHA+ Alliance community

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



Leicestershire County Council's Environment & Transport team hosted a work experience week, with local students and graduates.

Galliford Try and AECOM hosted a day, providing an overview of Melton Mowbray Distributor Road Project, from early project conception, transport strategy, planning and design stages.



Our impact

Sessions were interactive, placing students in the action by asking them to design their own transport route, taking into account the constraints and challenges posed during the design and construction of a project.


