Following on from the March 2018 RBAM output workshop - training and competence is one of the Well-managed Highways Infrastructure Code of Practice (CoP) topics identified as an action.

The proposal is to commission highway inspectors modular training and assessment – this incorporates the aspects of implementing the CoP requirements. The intention is to provide this over four days in October 2018.
