Upcoming event: Be an effective project sponsor

This new MHA course, set to be hosted on September 12 at Kents Hill Park Training & Conference in Milton Keynes, will assist in the skills development needed to undertake a Project Sponsor role.

The content emphasises that the role is not an engineering or project management position but a business function. A project sponsor is a challenging role, and the course provides a staged approach to managing the budget, maximising the benefits/cost ratio as well as tools and techniques in undertaking the sponsor role from the very beginning of the lifecycle.

Risk based Approach to Maintenance

In October 2016 UKRLG published its code of practice the 'Well managed Highway Infrastructure'. It introduced a change from reliance on specific guidance as in previous codes to promoting a risk based approach to establishing the levels of service.

The code of practice makes 36 recommendations that all need to be in place by Oct 2018.

With the overarching objective of producing MHA based guidelines a workshop was held on 18th July to look at where member authorities had got to. This workshop was very well attended and a good picture of where authorities are in the process was developed.

The data obtained will be collated and a gap analysis put together. This will be used to plan how we move forward and a working group is to meet in early September.
